Pursuant to the Notice of Publication in the Rockland Journal News on December 29, 2018, Rockland County Times on December 27, 2018, and Our Town on January 2, 2019, a public hearing was called to order by Mayor Christian at 7:34pm to elicit comments from members of the public regarding needed projects in South Nyack that would be eligible for 2019 Community Development Block Grant Funds.

According to the Rockland County Community Development Office, the Village of South Nyack no longer has a low income census tract that qualifies the Village to apply for CDBG funding. The Village is remaining in the consortium for the remainder of their agreement but will not participate in the application process for the FY2019. The public hearing is being held as a requirement of being a consortium member.

There was a discussion clarifying that at this time the Village would not be eligible for funding but will remain in the consortium.

At 7:36pm, upon motion made by Trustee Goodwillie, seconded by Deputy Mayor Leinbach and carried, the Public Hearing was adjourned.

Deputy Mayor Leinbach moved as follows:

#7 RESOLVED, that the Village of South Nyack will not submit a Community Development Block Grant application for the 2019 year because the Village does not meet the National Objective for an Area Benefit. The Village will remain in the consortium.

This resolution was seconded by Trustee Goodwillie and unanimously adopted.
