### South Nyack-Grand View Joint Police Board Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order by Mayor Christian at 6:34pm.

Mayor Christian opened public session at 6:34pm.

Mark Dery initiated discussion of creating civilian oversight board for South Nyack Police Department. Mayor Christian stated the JPB supported the creation of COB. Christian expressed concerns of the lengthy time required to create a COB against the South Nyack Police Department dissolving by end of 2021. Bill Stein, Esq stated legislation will be required to create COB. Christian, Trustee McCue, Trustee Lockett, and Mayor Lynn are willing to support creation of COB in Orangetown. Stein recommended using municipalities that have a COB in place as a model. Stein discussed the Rockland County Police Act must be considered to implement a COB.

Mayor Christian closed public session at 6:55pm.

#### Minutes:

Upon a motion by Mayor Christian, seconded by Trustee McCue, the minutes of the Joint Police Board meeting of 03/23/21 were adopted 4-0 as Trustee Abrams was excused during the approval.

Old Business:

1. Discussion of Executive Order 203: Chief Wilson reported South Nyack and Grand View individually adopted resolutions following necessary public meetings. The resolutions, SNGV Executive Order 203 report, and the certification form were emailed to the Director of the NYS Division of the Budget on April 1, 2021. Both Villages met the requirements of Executive Order 203.
2. Discussion of South Nyack dissolution: Chief Wilson reported the Village of South Nyack adopted a 12-month 2021-2022 budget. A 7-month budget for the South Nyack Police Department was adopted by the South Nyack Board of Trustees. The police budget goes to December 31, 2021. Wilson reported Orangetown has not announced how the full-time police officers will be transferred to the Orangetown Police Department.

New Business:

1. Patrick Kelly, part-time police officer, submitted a resignation letter to the Joint Police Board effective 03/25/21. Mayor Christian made a motion to accept Kelly's resignation letter effective 03/25/21. Seconded by Trustee Lockett. Passed 4-0 as Trustee Abrams was excused during the vote.
2. Chief Wilson reported South Nyack Village Hall was a collection site for National Drug Take-Back Day on 04/24/21. The event was successful.

Mayor Christian made a motion to adjourn at 7:08pm. Seconded by Mayor Lynn. Passed unanimously.
